Judge (Ret.) Mary McClatchey is Founder/President of WorkSmart Partners, a human capital management and employer compliance consultancy. McClatchey has over three decades of experience as a judge, employment and civil rights attorney, workplace mediator, organizational consultant, and trainer. Mary and her team advise, train, and consult with employers on how to create great places to work, mitigate risks of employment litigation, and improve bottom-line results. Primary focus areas include OD/human resources, harassment prevention, D & I and unconscious bias, workplace wellness, and flexible work programs.

McClatchey has founded, built, and served on the boards of several nonprofit organizations. A contract trainer with the Colorado Nonprofit Association and the Community Resource Center for several years, she brings great passion to her work helping nonprofits build their talent capacity so they can better achieve their crucial missions in their communities. She counts many nonprofit organizations and housing authorities among her clients.

McClatchey was formerly Senior Administrative Law Judge for the Colorado State Personnel Board, where she decided and mediated federal and state employment and civil rights cases for 15 years. Before that she was General Counsel for the Colorado Civil Rights Commission in the Colorado Attorney General's Office, a litigator in private practice, and a prosecutor.

Prior to law school, McClatchey spent several years as a community organizer, and cofounded the Women's Leadership Training Institute in Denver, Colorado.
